As their friendship grew, so did Bill's perspective and heart for the homeless. Realizing that his artistic talents could be utilized to help those less fortunate, Bill began to annually create a painting and Honor Card, sharing a subtle message about homelessness.

Since 1988, the annual Honor Card has raised over 8.5 million dollars to aid agencies and their outreach missions. Today, thirteen agencies across the state utilize the Honor Card as fundraising and education tool, with one hundred percent of every donation going directly to local agencies to support their programs

This year's car *You're Gonna Be Okay*, is a reminder of the consistent resolve and dedication that each local outreach agency brings to assisting those that have stumbled along life's path.
